FIRST READING 2 Samuel 11.26 – 12.13a

A reading from the second book of Samuel.

- 26 When the wife of Uriah heard that her husband was dead, she made lamentation for him.
- 27 When the mourning was over, David sent and brought her to his house, and she became his wife, and bore him a son. But the thing that David had done displeased the LORD,
- 1 The LORD sent Nathan to David. He came to him, and said to him, 'There were two men in a certain city, the one rich and the other poor.
- 2 The rich man had very many flocks and herds;
- 3 but the poor man had nothing but one little ewe lamb, which he had bought. He brought it up, and it grew up with him and with his children; it used to eat of his meagre fare, and drink from his cup, and lie in his bosom, and it was like a daughter to him.
- 4 Now there came a traveller to the rich man, and he was loath to take one of his own flock or herd to prepare for the wayfarer who had come to him, but he took the poor man's lamb, and prepared that for the guest who had come to him.'
- 5 Then David's anger was greatly kindled against the man. He said to Nathan, 'As the LORD lives, the man who has done this deserves to die;
- 6 he shall restore the lamb fourfold, because he did this thing, and because he had no pity.'
- 7 Nathan said to David, 'You are the man! Thus says the LORD, the God of Israel: I anointed you king over Israel, and I rescued you from the hand of Saul;
- 8 I gave you your master's house, and your master's wives into your bosom, and gave you the house of Israel and of Judah; and if that had been too little, I would have added as much more.
- 9 Why have you despised the word of the LORD, to do what is evil in his sight? You have struck down Uriah the Hittite with the sword, and have taken his wife to be your wife, and have killed him with the sword of the Ammonites.
- 10 Now therefore the sword shall never depart from your house, for you have despised me, and have taken the wife of Uriah the Hittite to be your wife.
- 11 Thus says the LORD: I will raise up trouble against you from within your own house; and I will take your wives before your eyes, and give them to your neighbour, and he shall lie with your wives in the sight of this very sun.
- 12 For you did it secretly; but I will do this thing before all Israel, and before the sun.'
- 13 David said to Nathan, 'I have sinned against the LORD.' Nathan said to David, 'Now the LORD has put away your sin; you shall not die.'

SECOND READING Ephesians 4: 1-6, 11-12 (Good News Bible)

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Ephesians.

I urge you, then - I who am a prisoner because I serve the Lord: live a life that measures up to the standard God set when he called you.

Be always humble, gentle, and patient. Show your love by being tolerant with one another.

Do your best to preserve the unity which the Spirit gives by means of the peace that binds you together.

There is one body and one Spirit, just as there is one hope to which God has called you.

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism; there is one God and Father of all people, who is Lord of all, works through all, and is in all.

It was he who "gave gifts to people"; he appointed some to be apostles, others to be prophets, others to be evangelists, others to be pastors and teachers.

He did this to prepare all God's people for the work of Christian service, in order to build up the body of Christ.

GOSPEL John 6.24–35

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

²⁴ When the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were at the place where Jesus had given the bread, they themselves got into the boats and went to Capernaum looking for Jesus.

²⁵ When they found him on the other side of the lake, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?'

²⁶ Jesus answered them, 'Very truly, I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves.

²⁷ Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For it is on him that God the Father has set his seal.'

²⁸ Then they said to him, 'What must we do to perform the works of God?'

²⁹ Jesus answered them, 'This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent.'

³⁰ So they said to him, 'What sign are you going to give us then, so that we may see it and believe you? What work are you performing?'

³¹ Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, "He gave them bread from heaven to eat."

³² Then Jesus said to them, 'Very truly, I tell you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.'

³⁴ They said to him, 'Sir, give us this bread always.'

³⁵ Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.'
