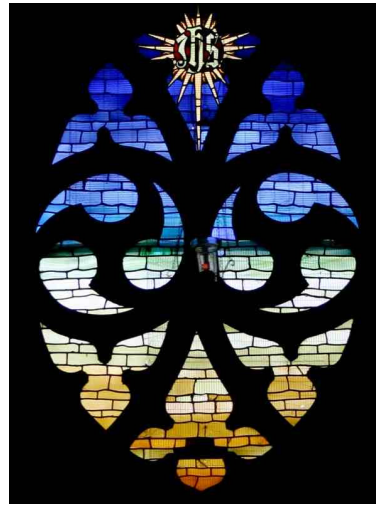


St Michael & All Angels

The 11:15 Service

The 11.15 service at St Michael's is a short service for people of all ages. It takes place on the second Sunday of every month at 11.15 am. A team of clergy and lay people take it in turns to plan the content of the service and to lead it. There are usually hymns and songs, prayers and intercessions and an all-age talk with an interactive element. The



St Michael's Band accompanies the singing; this is made up of mainly young people who take part on a voluntary basis.

Every three months the service will take the form of a simple Eucharist in the round.

Themed services have included

'Prayer' (with Beatles songs), 'Discipleship' and the annual Baptism Renewal service, when baptism families have been specially invited.

Refreshments are served from about 10.45a.m. (after the Sung Eucharist at 9.30a.m.) followed by the 11.15 service in the main body of the church.
