FIRST READING Romans 5.5-11

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans.

- Hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.
- For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly.
- Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die.
- But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.
- Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God.
- For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life.
- But more than that, we even boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

GOSPEL John 6:37-40

Jesus said to the crowds:

- "Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and anyone who comes to me I will never drive away;
- for I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of him who sent me.
- And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day.
- This is indeed the will of my Father, that all who see the Son and believe in him may have eternal life; and I will raise them up on the last day."
