FIRST READING I Kings 17.8–16

A reading from the first book of Kings.

- ⁸ The word of the LORD came to Elijah, saying,
⁹ ‘Go now to Zarephath, which belongs to Sidon, and live there; for I have commanded a widow there to feed you.’
¹⁰ So he set out and went to Zarephath. When he came to the gate of the town, a widow was there gathering sticks; he called to her and said, ‘Bring me a little water in a vessel, so that I may drink.’
¹¹ As she was going to bring it, he called to her and said, ‘Bring me a morsel of bread in your hand.’
¹² But she said, ‘As the LORD your God lives, I have nothing baked, only a handful of meal in a jar, and a little oil in a jug; I am now gathering a couple of sticks, so that I may go home and prepare it for myself and my son, that we may eat it, and die.’
¹³ Elijah said to her, ‘Do not be afraid; go and do as you have said; but first make me a little cake of it and bring it to me, and afterwards make something for yourself and your son.’
¹⁴ For thus says the LORD the God of Israel: The jar of meal will not be emptied and the jug of oil will not fail until the day that the LORD sends rain on the earth.’
¹⁵ She went and did as Elijah said, so that she as well as he and her household ate for many days.
¹⁶ The jar of meal was not emptied, neither did the jug of oil fail, according to the word of the LORD that he spoke by Elijah.

SECOND READING Galatians 1.11–24

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Galatians.

- ¹¹ I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that the gospel that was proclaimed by me is not of human origin;
- ¹² for I did not receive it from a human source, nor was I taught it, but I received it through a revelation of Jesus Christ.
- ¹³ You have heard, no doubt, of my earlier life in Judaism. I was violently persecuting the church of God and was trying to destroy it.
- ¹⁴ I advanced in Judaism beyond many among my people of the same age, for I was far more zealous for the traditions of my ancestors.
- ¹⁵ But when God, who had set me apart before I was born and called me through his grace, was pleased
- ¹⁶ to reveal his Son to me, so that I might proclaim him among the Gentiles, I did not confer with any human being,
- ¹⁷ nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were already apostles before me, but I went away at once into Arabia, and afterwards I returned to Damascus.
- ¹⁸ Then after three years I did go up to Jerusalem to visit Cephas and stayed with him fifteen days;
- ¹⁹ but I did not see any other apostle except James the Lord's brother.
- ²⁰ In what I am writing to you, before God, I do not lie!
- ²¹ Then I went into the regions of Syria and Cilicia,
- ²² and I was still unknown by sight to the churches of Judea that are in Christ;
- ²³ they only heard it said, 'The one who formerly was persecuting us is now proclaiming the faith he once tried to destroy.'
- ²⁴ And they glorified God because of me.

GOSPEL Luke 7.11–17

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

- ¹¹ Jesus went to a town called Nain, and his disciples and a large crowd went with him.
- ¹² As he approached the gate of the town, a man who had died was being carried out. He was his mother's only son, and she was a widow; and with her was a large crowd from the town.
- ¹³ When the Lord saw her, he had compassion for her and said to her, 'Do not weep.'
- ¹⁴ Then he came forward and touched the bier, and the bearers stood still. And he said, 'Young man, I say to you, rise!'
- ¹⁵ The dead man sat up and began to speak, and Jesus gave him to his mother.
- ¹⁶ Fear seized all of them; and they glorified God, saying, 'A great prophet has risen among us!' and 'God has looked favourably on his people!'
- ¹⁷ This word about him spread throughout Judea and all the surrounding country.
